Video Contest Guidelines



Eligibility: 5th grade through 12th grade students who are New Jersey residents

Format:

- The video can be <u>up to 30 seconds</u> long.
 *Videos over 30 seconds will be disqualified.
- 2. Video must be submitted in one of the following formats: .AVI, .MOV, .MP4, MPEGPS, or .WMV.

Requirements:

- 1. The video must cover only $\underline{\mathbf{1}}$ of the four vaccine categories:
 - a. Tdap
 - b. HPV
 - c. Meningococcal
 - d. Flu
 - *A video discussing more than one vaccine will be disqualified.
- 2. The video must contain at least 3 facts from www.protectmewith3.com such as
 - a. Why you need to be vaccinated.
 - b. Facts about the disease(s) the vaccine prevents.*Entries with information from other sources will be disqualified
- 3. The video must contain the statement: "For more information go to www.protectmewith3.com"
 - a. This statement can be spoken or written as text in your video.
- 4. The video must contain the statement: "Talk to your parents about getting vaccinated.

Your health is worth a shot!"

a. This statement can be spoken or written as text in your video.

Submission:

- 1. Early Bird Submit on or before January 1, 2020:
 - a. If your video is submitted by January 1, you will be entered into a drawing to win a prize!

- Vaccination message

GENERAL CONTEST RULES:

- 1. Students must be residents of New Jersey.
- 2. A group of students may enter the contest, but prizes will be awarded per entry, not per individual participant.
- 3. Group entries should only be submitted one time by one group member (Team Captain).
- 4. Each student can only work on one entry, either as an individual or as a group.
- 5. Entries must be students' original work and contain no copyrighted material.
- 6. Entries can be in **English or Spanish**.
- 7. Any music or audio used in a video must be original or royalty-free.
- 8. To ensure the most current information is used, entries shall <u>only use</u> information provided on <u>www.protectmewith3.com</u>. <u>Do not</u> use information obtained from other organization websites listed in the "resource" sections.
- 9. Entries must focus on **one** vaccine.
- 10. All students under the age of 18, will need parent/guardian permission to participate.
- 11. If selected as a finalist, each team member will be required to complete a **Photo and Video Consent Form.**
- 12. All winners will be notified of their selection by e-mail.
- 13. Winners are encouraged to attend the Awards Ceremony in order to receive their prize.
- 14. All submissions will become the property of Protect Me With 3⁺ and its sponsors. All rights for reproduction in all media including print, film, web, and/or video are assigned to the organizers and their sponsors to use as deemed appropriate for the goals of the contest and the Protect Me With 3⁺ campaign.

Entries must NOT contain:

- 1. Spelling mistakes or mispronunciations.
- 2. Information from the "resources" section of www.protectmewith3.com or from other organizations/sources.
- 3. Information on more than 1 vaccine.
- 4. Brand names or trademarks of vaccines (example: Gardasil for HPV).
- 5. Copyrighted music or audio.
- 6. Material that violates or infringes another's rights, including but not limited to privacy, publicity or intellectual property rights, or that constitutes copyright or license infringement.
- 7. Material that is inappropriate, indecent, obscene, hateful, defamatory, slanderous or libelous.

- 8. Material that promotes bigotry, racism, hatred or harm against any group or individual or promotes discrimination based on race, sex, religion, nationality, disability, sexual orientation or age.
- 9. Material that is unlawful, in violation of or contrary to the laws or regulations in any state where the entry is created.
- 10. Entries must not have been submitted previously in a promotion or contest of any kind, or exhibited or displayed publicly.

Any entry that does not follow contest rules will be disqualified.
